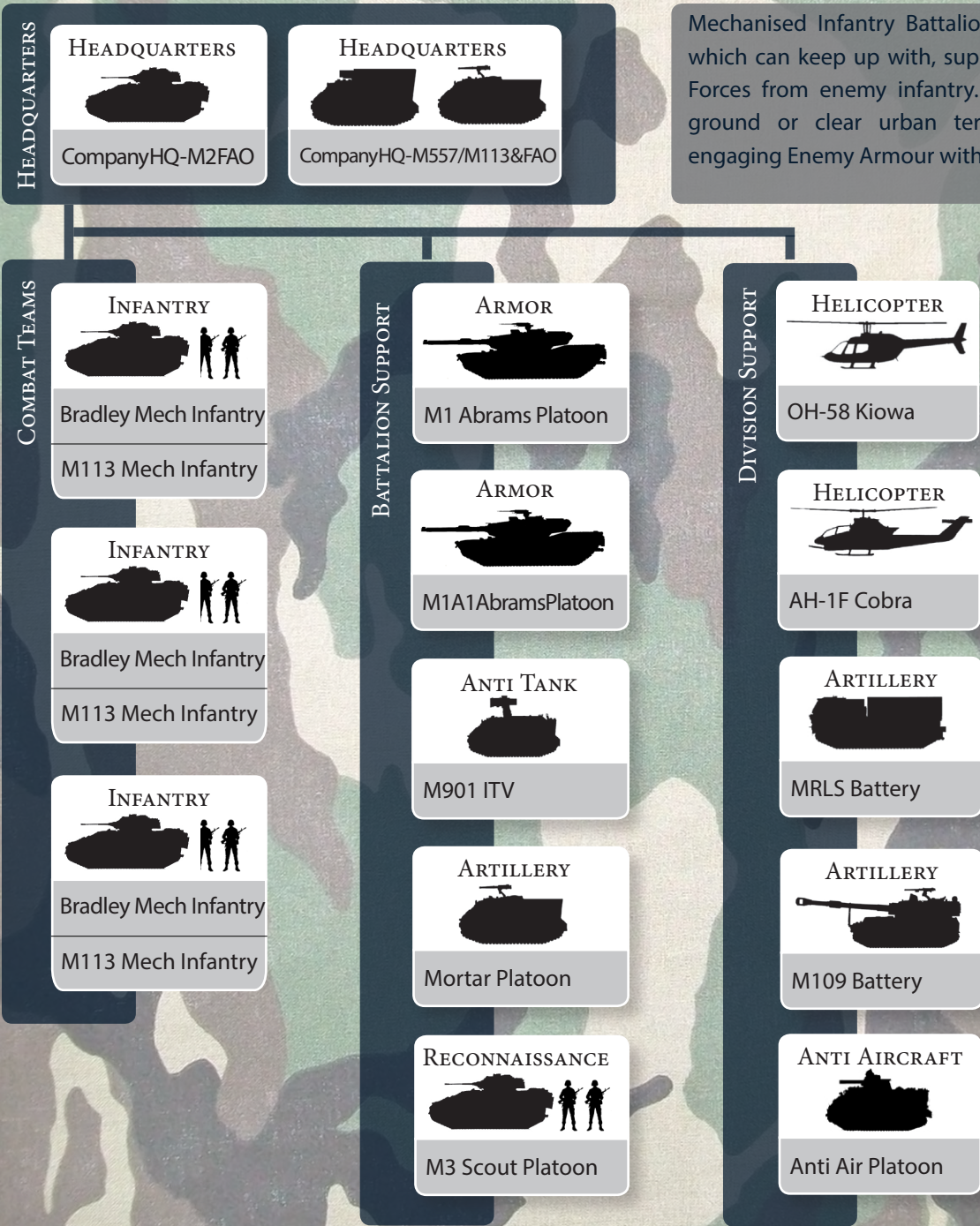

# US ARMY MECHANIZED BATTALION

Mechanised Infantry Battalions are versatile formations which can keep up with, support and protect Armoured Forces from enemy infantry. Able to switch to occupy ground or clear urban terrain, moving rapidly and engaging Enemy Armour with their ATGM's and Vehicles

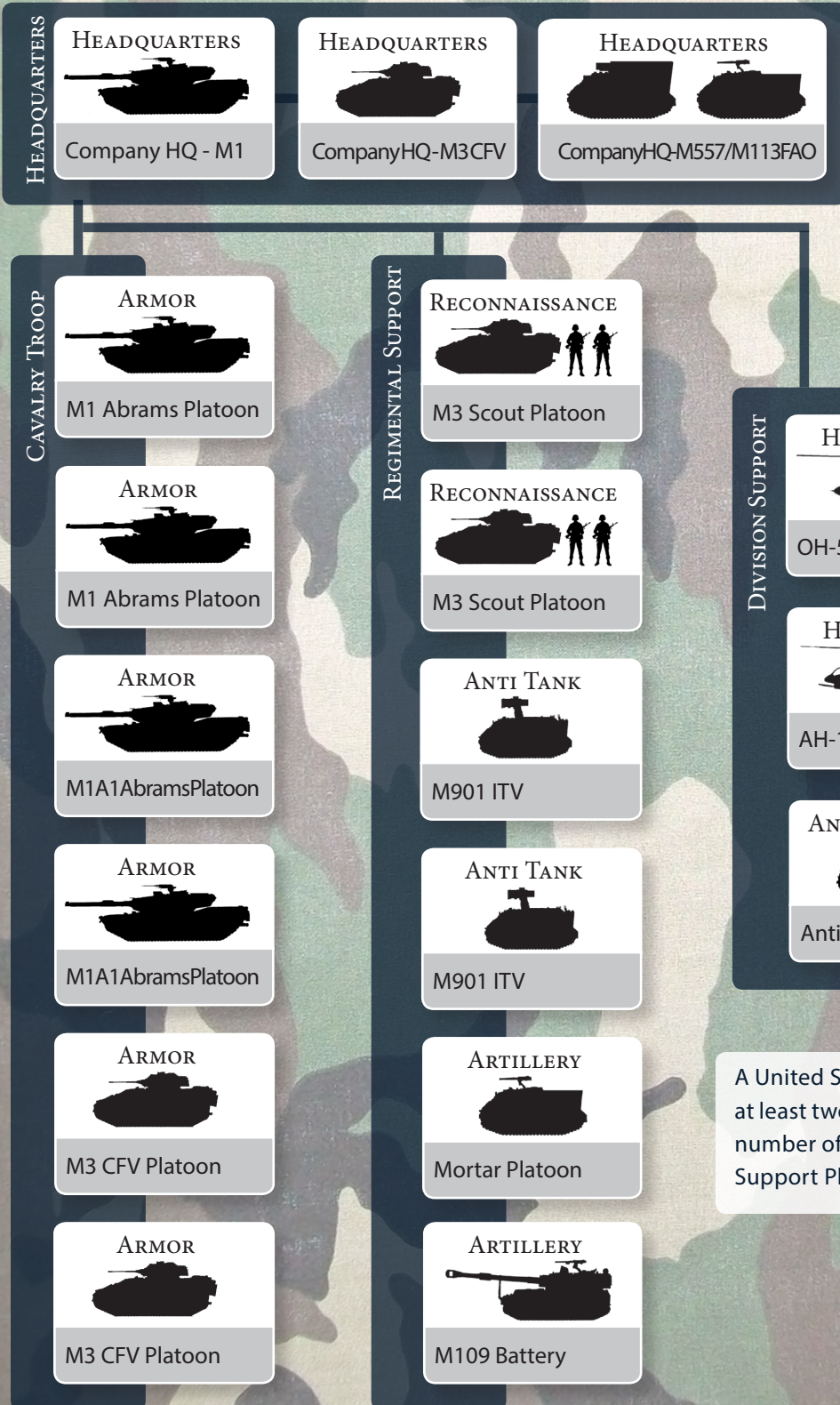


A United States Army force must contain a HQ and at least two Combat Teams. The force can contain any number of Battalion Support Platoons or Division Support Platoons, but only one from each box. All combat companies must be either M113 Mech infantry or Bradley Mech infantry platoons.



# US ARMY CAVALRY TROOP

The US Cavalry moves rapidly and hits hard, extremely hard. Despite being primarily covering forces for heavier formations, when concentrated they are formidable. Possessing a very fluid organizational system they could move around assets as required within their own regiment.

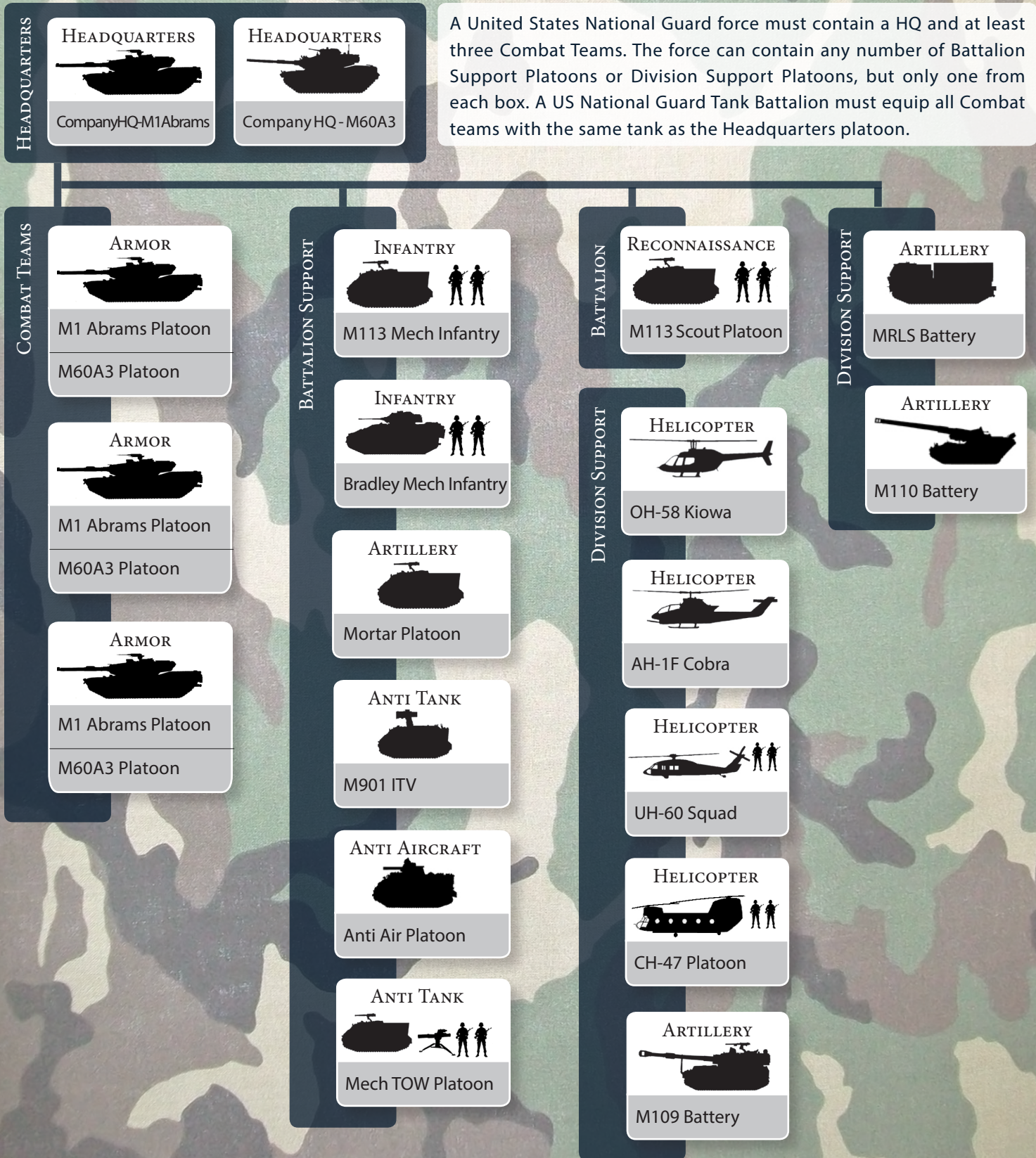

# US NATIONAL GUARD TANK BATTALION

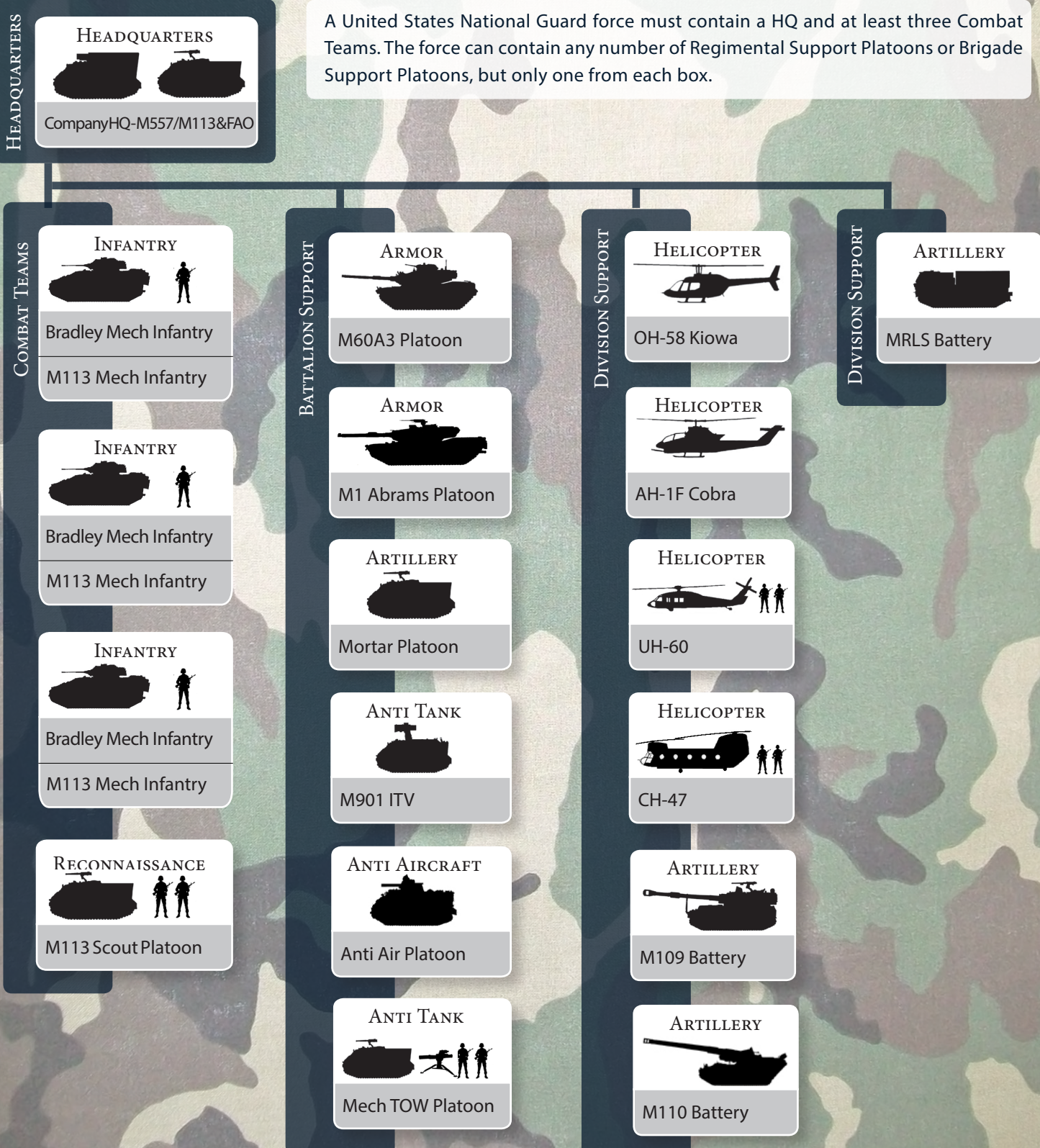
A United States National Guard force must contain a HQ and at least three Combat Teams. The force can contain any number of Battalion Support Platoons or Division Support Platoons, but only one from each box. A US National Guard Tank Battalion must equip all Combat teams with the same tank as the Headquarters platoon.





# US NATIONAL GUARD MECHANISED BATTALION

A United States National Guard force must contain a HQ and at least three Combat Teams. The force can contain any number of Regimental Support Platoons or Brigade Support Platoons, but only one from each box.

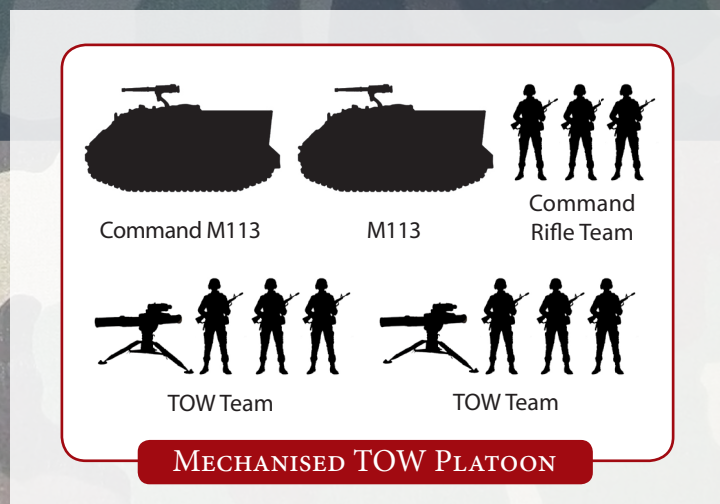

\* A fire team will fire as an SMG, RIFLE or SAW Team. Any support weapons within the fire team, are fired separately and can target other valid targets within range, allowing a Rifle Fire team with a Grenade Launcher to fire their Rifles at the Infantry and the Support Weapon Grenadier to fire at their soft skin transport. Equally a Rifle Team with a GPMG can choose to fire the GPMG at another target or the same target as the situation dictates.
